Mail the Reservation/Purchase Form, with a check, to Special Events Treasurer, Cathy Brown at 2273 Senseny Rd, Berryville, VA 22611. Give your unit and your name at the door and get your assigned table number. Donation items will be collected for **CCAPs** (Congregational Community Action Project) in Winchester, Frederick, and Warren Counties, and **Mobile Hope** in Loudoun County. Again, these organizations were chosen to honor UMW unit wishes and concerns to support local mission work in the Winchester District.

**CCAP** is a cooperative ministry of 45 area churches and one synagogue that joined together to serve the Winchester, Frederick County area by providing aid and assistance to people in need. **CCAP** maintains a complete food pantry, operates a clothing room for all sizes, and offers financial assistance in areas such as rent, utilities, and prescription drugs. **Mobile Hope** supports children and young adults (age 24 and younger) living in Loudoun County who are homeless, have uncertain housing, or are at risk. **Mobile Hope** offers food, clothing, personal hygiene and other items to children in need from its mobile bus staged at designated Leesburg locations, which vary each week of the month.

**Items to bring:** Laundry & dish detergent, dryer sheets, Clorox wipes, wet wipes, toilet paper, paper towels, tissues; shampoo & conditioner, razors & shave cream, mouthwash, tooth brushes & tooth paste, soap, deodorant, feminine products, hair brushes & combs, wash cloths & hand towels, diapers sizes 3-6 mostly, pull-ups, baby wipes; canned vegetables (peas/carrots/beans), canned fruit in juice, macaroni & cheese, rice, pasta, spaghetti sauce with meat, canned tuna/chicken/meat, hearty soups, beef stew, oatmeal pancake mix, syrup, breakfast bars, small boxed cereal, peanut butter & jelly/jam, 100% juice boxes, powdered drink mix, snacks (popcorn, crackers, protein bars), shelf-stable milk, Chef Boyardee products; new socks boys & girls, new underwear boys & girls, new boys tee-shirts. (*Mobile Hope's preference is food, hygiene, and baby items.*) **Donated items can also decorate your table as a creative centerpiece!**

**Food Lion** and **Wal-Mart gift cards** (and checks) are welcomed and will be given to the **Agape Christian Children's Community Center** and the **Wesley Community Service Center (WCSC)**, which is a United Methodist Women supported ministry. The **WCSC** provides nutrition and social programs for the elderly, teen counseling services, community activities, and a preschool program. **WCSC's** programs aim at empowering the powerless and the poor in Portsmouth's southside communities.

The **Agape Christian Children's Community Center** ministers to the children and surrounding area of Horntown VA. The Agape Center strives to heal the hurts of this community by spreading the love of Jesus Christ through a preschool for 3 and 4-year old children (open 11 hours daily, Mon to Fri). The Agape Center has after school programs for kids in kindergarten through second grade. It also has a summer program that welcomes children ages 3 to 11 with activities for each age group. The Agape Center is open year-round.
